# WILL YOU HAVE A CHILD READY FOR KINDERGARTEN IN 2026?

**Kindergarten Registration Day is**

**January 16, 2026, 2:00 PM or 4:30 PM**

Please mark your calendar! We will need assistance from Pinewood families to let us know if you have a child eligible for kindergarten next year. Remember, students must be **five years of age by July 31, 2026**. Please call the office at 531-299-1940 if your child will be eligible or if you know someone who is.

## ILLNESS GUIDELINES

We have begun to see an increase in the number of ill children at school. In order to prevent the spread of disease, please consider the following guidelines:

**Please keep your child home if any one of the following occurs:**

Temperature of 100 degrees or higher within the last 24 hours

Vomiting or diarrhea within the last 24 hours

Any symptoms of acute illness such as persistent cough, runny nose, or body aches

Red eye(s) **accompanied by discharge**, a classic sign of conjunctivitis (pink eye)

Your child should behave like him/herself for 24 hours before returning to school. This will protect your child from exposure to other illness before they are able to build resistance. It will also protect other students and staff from what your child may transmit.



# Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

Pinewood students continue to participate in the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable program. Students have the opportunity to learn about fruits & vegetables and taste a sample twice a week. *Eat Well! Live Well!*

## Winter Safety Tips

\*Always be sure that your children come to school dressed appropriately for the current weather and the weather forecast for later in the day. Layers of clothing are a must for all age levels. Even as the outdoor temperature fluctuates, our rule at Pinewood is that students must have long sleeves at recess on cool days (this could be a shirt, or jacket/coat over short sleeves).

\*Be alert to changing weather. Usually, area media announce school closures beginning at around 6:00 am. Your family plan should include emergency care for students when school is cancelled due to bad weather. You will also receive texts or emails from the district. Be sure your information is updated!

# SCHOOL APPLICATIONS FOR THE 2026-27 SCHOOL YEAR

**January 2026** starts the school application process for the 2026-2027 school year. Parents / Guardians of students enrolled in a transition grade (last grade at the current school), **will receive an email with a link to the application on January 5<sup>th</sup>.**

Parents may apply for their child to attend any elementary or middle school in the Omaha Public Schools. Approval of applications is subject to the availability of space at the requested school(s) and the priorities set forth in the School Assignment Plan. Only enrollment into neighborhood schools is guaranteed.

The current Student Assignment Plan considers the student's residence and distance to school, to determine transportation eligibility. The Plan is organized around eight (8) elementary partner zones and four (4) middle school partner zones within the District. The residential address and corresponding neighborhood school identify the partner zone.
