





NOBEL PRIZE WINNER

Mandela led the fight against South Africa's apartheid system, which separated the country's diverse racial groups and limited the movement of Black people. He spent 27 years in prison for his efforts, but continued to mobilize political prisoners and work toward equality.


NOBEL PRIZE

Alfred Nobel was born in Sweden in 1833. He grew up doing experiments with his inventor father. In 1867 he invented dynamite from the compound nitroglycerin.

Alfred would see his invention used for both good and evil. A close friend of his inspired him to leave his fortune to scientists and "influencers" who made the world better, which we now call the "Nobel Prizes."

NELSON MANDELA WON THE 1993 NOBEL PEACE PRIZE FOR HIS WORK TO END APARTHEID AND ESTABLISH A DEMOCRATIC SOUTH AFRICA, ALONG WITH FREDERIK WILLEM DE KLERK, THE SOUTH AFRICAN PRESIDENT WHO RELEASED HIM FROM PRISON

Mandela; 18 July 1918 - 5 December 2013) was a South African anti-apartheid activist and politician who served as the first president of South Africa from 1994 to 1999.
